## Vinīta Bhikkhu visits Westfield

On 14th December Vinīta Bhikkhu, a monk from the Amaravati Buddhist monastery near Great Gaddesden visited the school.

In a busy schedule, Vinīta Bhikkhu visited both the Year 6 classes and Year R in the morning and Year 5 in the afternoon. All of these classes were either currently studying Buddhism or will be studying it this year.

The rest of Key Stage 1 and 2 also got to learn about the life of a Buddhist monk as Vinīta Bhikkhu was our special guest at the morning assembly. He gave a wonderful insight into a life very different from that experienced by the children, many of whom were particularly shocked to learn that a Buddhist monk can only watch three films a year.

The children also learned about what it feels like to be dependent on others for your very food and many of the Year 6 children had brought in food for Vinīta Bhikkhu to take back to the monastery. The assembly ended with a period of meditation.

The whole school is very grateful to Vinīta Bhikkhu for providing us with such a rich learning experience. We hope to maintain and deepen our connection with the monastery in future.

Twelve of our year 6 children put themselves in the 'Stretch Zone' when they entered the Inter-school maths challenge at Ashlyns School on Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> January. ### **Year 6 Nevelson Talk Arctic on Face Time**

Year 6 are studying 'Extreme Earth' and it has to be said; both the teachers and the children are loving it! There has been a particular focus on Antarctica and the Arctic.

On Thursday 25th January, Team Nevelson were lucky enough to Face Time with a scientist and a cameraman who explore and study polar regions, including Antarctica and the Arctic. Jeremy Wilkinson, a sea ice physicist who has been to the Arctic more than 20 times, was grilled by the children who questioned him about his favourite expeditions, his inspiration to do what he does, and what transportation he uses to travel across these amazing lands.

They also learnt about the World Economic Forum, that was being attended by world leaders as they spoke, and the need to spread the word about the effects of climate change and how we can all play a part in trying to

protect our planet. This unique opportunity left the class buzzing and only fuelled their wonder and fascination for the natural world.

This month Milo has really enjoyed returning to school after the Christmas break and is now very settled into his daily routine. On Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> January, Year 5 and 6 received a follow up stranger danger assembly from PC Sue Desmond in light of the e-mail sent to parents last week's sharing the concern raised by a child that he felt he had been followed on the way to school.

We are very proud of the child for applying the skills he had learnt from previous talks and would like to thank the police for acting upon our concerns so quickly.

During the assembly the children were reminded of how to keep safe when walking to and from school. The children were encouraged to walk together in small groups, use their usual route and to inform an adult if they were concerned about anything on their journey to and from school. "Top tips to talk about stranger danger at an appropriate age level with your child." This communication was sent out this week via email.
