


<p><b><u>Art/English</u></b></p> <p>In English we are looking at the story of Hansel and Gretel. Can you recreate the gingerbread house in the story? You could draw, colour, paint, use lego, create a sculpture, bake a cake – you can be as creative as you like.</p>	<p><b><u>Computing</u></b></p> <p>In Computing we are looking at digital photography. Can you take a photograph from the following categories?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Nature</li> <li>- Hobbies</li> <li>- Animals</li> <li>- Food or Drink</li> <li>- Funny Photo</li> </ul>	<p><b><u>Cooking</u></b></p> <p>Bake some gingerbread men. If you have a recipe book at home you can look in that or if not search online for a recipe.</p>
<p><b><u>Science</u></b></p> <p>In Science our topic is Animals including humans. We will be looking at what food is healthy. Plan a healthy packed lunch. <p><b><u>Science and History</u></b></p> <p>How much have you changed since you were a baby? What can you do now that you couldn't do as a baby? How have you changed? Plot a timeline to map the changes. You can include photographs.</p>	<p><b><u>Poetry</u></b></p> <p>Choose your favourite poem and learn it off by heart. If it's a long one then one verse is fine! Some ideas: The Owl and the Pussycat, The Quangle Wangle's Hat, The Pobble who has no toes, The Magic Box, The Sound Collector. But you can also choose your own if you prefer!</p>	<p><b><u>Christmas</u></b></p> <p>Make a paper Snowflake</p> 
<p><b><u>Maths</u></b></p> <p>Choose some household objects to represent a 2-digit number.</p> <p>Challenge: Think of a mystery 2-digit number and give clues for someone to guess the number.</p>	<p><b><u>Christmas/RE</u></b></p> <p>Can you tell the Christmas Story? You can do this by comic strip, a video or audio of you retelling the story, or even on the computer using Minecraft or similar. Be creative!</p>	<p><b><u>History</u></b></p> <p>We are comparing toys from the 1960's to toys and games today. Can you play a traditional game at home with a family member?</p> <p>Some ideas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Dominoes</li> <li>Card games</li> <li>Chess</li> <li>Draughts</li> </ul>
