### Parents' Evening

Opportunity to discuss how your child has settled into their new class, how their learning behaviours are supporting their progress, understand their next steps and how you can support these at home.

### Class newsletters

Shared every term, through email and on the school website, these letters provide an overview of what your child will be focussing on that term. This provides you with the opportunity to explore these areas of learning too at home through conversations and activities.

### **Curriculum Maps**

Available on the school website, these maps give an overview of what will be covered in each year group at particular points in the year. This can be used to pre-empt what your children will be learning and to have an understanding of the foci for each half term.

## Open Learning Mornings

Occurring across the year, with a variety of themes, these mornings are the opportunity to join in with your child's learning in the classroom. The activities are often things you can recreate at home too.

# Child Shows Parent

An opportunity to look through your child's learning with them. Ask them to talk about what they have been learning, using the books to focus your conversation on.

### Homework

Weekly homework provides you with an opportunity to see what your child is learning at school. All homework will consolidate learning that has already happened. At times, there may be opportunities for extended homework, which provide the opportunity to look into a subject area in more detail (e.g. The Romans).

# Open Evening

Enjoy seeing your child talking about and showing you their favourite learning from the year and take a sneak peak at the learning to come in the next year.

### Regularly Reading

Reading regularly with your child and filling in the reading record provides a home/ school correspondence and alignment in supporting your child's next steps. Reading is vital in unlocking our understanding of the world!

## End of year report

A written report by the class teacher, which summarises your child's progress socially, emotionally and academically throughout the year. The report will also include a written comment from your child about their year and invite you to comment back on how you feel the year has been for your child.

### **School Performances**

An opportunity to celebrate the children showcasing their singing and acting skills as well as demonstrating their Westfield values!

### Meet the Teacher

At the start of each school year, you are invited to attend a meeting with your child's new teacher to hear about the new year, the opportunities that your child will be having and how you can support these at home. The class teacher will also answer questions and give you clarity on any new expectations of that year group.
