RAAC (Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete) in school buildings

You may well have seen in the news that some schools have been affected by the presence of RAAC in their buildings. RAAC, or Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete, is a lightweight form of concrete which was used in schools and other building construction from the 1950's until the mid-1990s. After some time and in some circumstances this concrete can collapse.

However, we wanted to reassure you that the County Council had this school surveyed by properly qualified building surveyors in the last few years. We can confirm that there is no RAAC in this school, and no risk to pupils or staff.

Start of Term Reminders

Below are a few key reminders as we start the new school year:

Snacks

In Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children are given a snack each day and therefore we do not allow additional snacks to be brought in from home. In Years 3,4,5 and 6, children may bring in a fruit or vegetable snack only (fruit winders / strings are not allowed please). The only exception to this is if the children require additional and specialist foods to align with their medical needs / individual support plans. We thank you for your cooperation with this.

Water Bottles

Please ensure that your child comes into school with a FULL water bottle containing fresh WATER only. We do not allow squash or other flavoured drinks in school which is in line with our "Healthy Schools" policy. Any water bottles containing flavoured or sugary drinks may be emptied and refilled with water. Thank you for your understanding.

Start and Finish Times

The children have been brilliant at finding their new classrooms and being on time this week. Just as a reminder in case your child has changed Key Stage and their timings are slightly different.

ALL CLASSES

Arrive from 08:35 and gates close promptly at 08:50

EYFS pick up at 15:00 from the classroom door

KS1 pick up at 15:10 from the KS1 garden area

Years 3 & 4 pick up at 15:20 from the main playground.

Any Year 5/ 6 children that are walking home will be dismissed at 15:20 – Year 5/6 children being collected from school will be dismissed from the 'meeting place' (playground at the front of the school).

Uniform & Personal Belongings

Please ensure that all personal items are named, including uniform (renaming of 2nd hand uniform), coats, shoes, PE kits, bags, lunch boxes and water bottles.

Headlice

Please check your child's hair on a regular basis for headlice, treat as required and inform the school office.

Jewellery

No jewellery is permitted in school except for small stud earrings provided they are removed or covered with surgical tape/plasters for PE lessons. Make-up, nail varnish, tattoos, shaved or braided hair are not permitted. Long hair should also be tied back with a suitable school uniform coloured hair band.

Parking

When parking on the roads near school please show consideration to local residents and do not obstruct driveways. Please do not park in Farm Place as this is private parking for residents only.

Reporting Absences (Illness)

If your child is ill with sickness or diarrhoea, they should remain absent from school for 48 hours after the last bout of illness. Please report all absences to the school office by 9am. Any absences that are not reported by parents will be recorded as unauthorised.

Contact Information

Please remember to tell us as soon as possible if you change any of your details, e.g. home address, telephone number, email address.

End of Day Collection Arrangements

It is essential that the school knows if there is any change in collection arrangements for your child. Please ring the office before 3pm if someone other than the person known to staff is to collect your child at the end of the day.

Playground Health & Safety

For health and safety reasons, the use of playground equipment is NOT allowed before or after school, even under parent supervision. Please ensure you supervise your children at all times when they are in your care and once you have collected your child at the end of the day, please leave the school grounds promptly. Children should not be hanging around the school grounds with parents or on their own as we have a number of after school clubs and childcare provision using the school premises. Thank you for your support.

Pupil Premium and Free School Meals – ACTION REQUIRED

Did you know that by registering your child for free school meals, we can claim extra money to support your child's education? Plus, you can register even if your child has a home provided packed lunch. Registering for Free School Meals could mean an extra £1,345 to enhance your child's education. All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to receive a Universal Infant Free School Meal but unless you register with us, the school will not receive the funding.

We ask **ALL** families (irrespective of their income status) to register their child to receive a meal. It's quick and easy and only has to be done once and if all families register, the school will not miss out on additional funding entitlement.
