## A message from Miss Leach



This week we have been "Cool to be Kind", which is Westfield's version of Anti-Bullying week. Research shows that if we talk about the behaviour that we want to see, we will get better outcomes. Thank you for continuing to support us with positive language and having positive conversations with your children, we have started to see a difference in the way children are responding to situations around school. Questions like "what's gone well today" are really helpful.

Alongside this, we've launched a new playground initiative called "positive paperchains" which all classes are involved in. Positive playground behaviour is rewarded instantly with a visual link to go on the chain for the class, and then the school chain - look out for it when you are next in school!

#### The Big Ambition – Have Your Say!



The Children's Commissioner for England, Dame Rachel de Souza, has launched The Big Ambition, a national survey of children and young people across England.

The Big Ambition aims to hear from children across England on what they think is important! In the lead up to the next General Election, the Children's Commissioner wants to take children's thoughts, opinions and ideas to decision-makers, to make sure that the Government hears young people's voices on what they think needs to be done to make children's lives better in England.

The Big Ambition survey will be open until Friday 15th December.

The Big Ambition is open to children and young people in England aged 0-18 years old. The survey takes around 10 minutes to complete and can be completed on mobile phones, tablets, laptops and computers.

The survey asks for information about the person responding, the child's age, and what school they attend. There is also an option to complete an easy-read version with larger text. The questions are slightly different depending on the age of the child answering, but, everyone is asked what they think the Government should do to make children's lives better.

#### **Punctuality Reminders**

Thank you to everyone who arrives on time every day at school.

Unfortunately, we have a growing number of families arriving late at school. We appreciate 'one-offs' and exceptional circumstances do mean that occasionally children may be late into school. However, we have a growing number of children who are persistently late, meaning vital learning is being missed by some children.

Being late affects children negatively both socially and academically. It is really important that children arrive on time. It also means that both office and teaching staff time is taken up with ensuring children who are late get into school rather than focusing on their work, which staff should be at this time.

School gates close at 8:50am every morning. Please ensure that your child is in school by this time every day. Being on time creates positive, life long habits which are vitally important for children to develop.

Please can we also remind you that if your child is absent for any reason, you MUST telephone or email the school office before 9am on each day of absence detailing the reason.

If you are struggling with any aspect of attendance or punctuality, please do reach out to us. There are many ways that we can work together to improve the situation. Thank you for your ongoing support.

#### Primary Admissions – Applying for a Reception Place for September 2024

For children born between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2019 – 31<sup>st</sup> August 2020, you can now apply for your child to start Reception in September 2024. An "Under 11s leaflet" from Herts County Council, giving details of how to apply will have been sent to all families of Nursery age children in Hertfordshire.
