A message from Miss Slade

I'd like to introduce myself as the schools Special Educational Needs Coordinator (or SENDCo for short).

My role is to oversee and co-ordinate the support and provision for the children in our school who have special educational needs and disabilities (SEND)

I work closely with parents, teachers and teaching assistants to ensure that we are doing our best in supporting children with SEND in meeting their next steps, and I also co-ordinate any external professionals who may come in to support

We hold paramount that you as parents know your children best, so should you have any concerns about either your child's social, emotional and mental health needs, or their learning needs, then please share these concerns with your child's class teacher in the first instance.

What are the 4 areas of SEND?

In the SEND Code of Practice, there are four broad areas of special educational needs, that should be identified and focused on within educational settings.

The four main SEND areas are:

Communication and Interaction

-Cognition and Learning -Social, Emotional and Mental Health difficulties

Physical and/or Sensory Needs

It's not always as easy as fitting into one area - sometimes children have multiple needs. Contact your child's teacher if you need to know more

Diary Dates and Spring Term Class Newsletters

IMPORTANT REMINDER - WE ARE A NUT-FREE SCHOOL

Can we please remind you we are a nut free school so please can we ask that there are no nuts or nut products in lunch boxes or brought into the school as treats or snacks. For example:

- Packaged nuts
- Peanut butter or chocolate spreads containing nuts
- Cereal, granola or chocolate bars containing nuts
- Cake or biscuits containing nuts
- Peanut-based sauces like satay
- Any food made with sesame seeds (which can cause a similar allergic reaction)

The above list is not exhaustive. If you are sending your child to school with food such as a snack or a packed lunch, please check the ingredient lists carefully.

Both children and adults with severe nut allergies can suffer from life-threatening reactions if they eat, smell, or touch any foods containing nuts.

We would be grateful for your cooperation in helping to keep all our pupils, staff, parents and visitors safe and remember not to send children to school with food which contains nuts or nut products. Thank you.

Cold Weather Clothing Reminder

With the colder weather upon us, we would just like to remind you to make sure that your child wraps up warmly and wears a warm coat, hat and gloves to school each day. Please also ensure that all articles of clothing are clearly labelled with your child's name especially school sweat shirts/cardigans and coats as it does make returning lost property much easier. Thank you.

Deadline for Primary Admissions for September 2024

Reminder: The deadline to apply for a Reception place for September 2024 is Monday 15th January 2024. It is essential that you apply online via the Herts County Council admissions portal: www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/admissions by this deadline for your application to be considered in the first round of allocations.

Nursery Admissions for September 2024

Applications for children to start our Nursery in September 2024 will open on Monday 26th February and we will have Nursery tours starting from Tuesday 23rd January. If you have a child who is born from 1st September 2020 to 31st August 2021 or know of someone who has a child of this age and would like to come and find out all about our Early Years provision, please contact the school office to book onto one of our tours (dates below). Pupil Premium and Free School Meals

Did you know that by registering your child for free school meals, we can claim extra money to support your child's education? Registering for Free School Meals could mean an extra £1,455 to enhance your child's education. All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to receive a Universal Infant Free School Meal however unless you register with us, the school will not receive the funding.

<u>We ask ALL families (irrespective of their income status) to register their child to receive a meal.</u> It's quick and easy and only has to be done once and if all families register, the school will not miss out on additional funding entitlement. Monday 26 February 2024 – Nursery applications open

Application via online form on the schools' website (paper copies are available from schools on request)

Thursday 28 March 2024 – Nursery applications close for on time applications (applications can be accepted at any point after this date, but will be dealt with after on time applications)

Friday 19 April 2024 - Nursery places are offered to families by email

Friday 26 April 2024 – Deadline for accepting Nursery places

(From 26 April onwards we can continue to accept applications and allocate Nursery places to children, based on availability)


