A message from Miss Leach...



After several weeks of rain, it was a wonderful pleasure to finally see some sun peeking through today. As you can imagine, the weather has caused the roof project to run a bit behind schedule but we will know a little more about this next week when we receive an update on the plan.

At Westfield we are continually striving to improve our writing, and this academic year we are determined that our outcomes in all subjects, across the school, will be a marked improvement on the previous year's results in all areas.

You may remember that we have been accepted to be part of the HFL pilot for English, and as part of this we have been introduced to a range of new texts which have been specifically chosen to inspire our young writers. The children learn a range of different writing styles and genres across the year groups, and these are built upon year by year. These well-chosen texts provide our learners with good quality models for their writing, and they are exposed to rich language structures which show them how writing works and the effect that it can have on the reader. You can also help at home with this by encouraging the reading of different texts such as magazines and newspapers or listening to audiobooks.

A message from

Hello! I'm Mrs Rance and I teach in Year 2 Thomas. As well as this, I also lead music across the whole school. This includes ensuring the curriculum is embedded and that children are making progress in this subject from EYFS up to Year 6.

I am delighted with the opportunities in music available to our pupils at Westfield. We have Rock Steady, instrument lessons, choir (KS2), Ukulele lessons (Y5) and Young Voices (Y6), year group productions, Harvest, Christmas and Easter celebrations and our weekly singing assembly.

Alongside these, we also teach music in each year group following a scheme of work. We look at appraising, composing, improvising and performing in each lesson with these skills being repeated and built upon each year.

Topic 1

We have some exciting musical events happening soon.

On 2nd February our Year 6 pupils and staff team are off to Wembley to join children from other schools across England to become part of one of the biggest choirs. They have been rehearsing songs for months ahead of this, with some difficult melodies and lyrics.

We will also be having a summer serenade next term. So if your child sings or plays an instrument and would like to showcase their talents – watch this space!

We run a choir for our Key Stage 2 pupils. It runs, currently on a Monday lunchtime. We would love for more children to join and grow this choir.

As a choir member you get the expertise of a singing teacher, and the opportunity to learn and perform a range of songs. If your child is interested please ask them to speak to me.

Topic 2

Our Year 3 and 4 pupils are currently taking part in The Choral Project. This is an exciting opportunity that they have been given where they have a choral animateur in teaching them vocal warm ups and a wide range of songs from all around the world. This culminates with a performance at St Albans Abbey. We hope this it will encourage the children to enjoy singing.


