## A message from Mrs Trinder

Bonjour, je m'appelle Mrs Trinder and I teach in Year 6 O'Keeffe. As well as this, I also lead MFL (Modern Foreign Languages) across Key Stage 2. This includes ensuring the French curriculum is embedded and that children are making progress in this subject from Year 2 to Year 6.

As some of you may know, we use Language Angels to support our weekly teaching and learning of French. Lessons are engaging, interactive and promote the use of speaking and listening skills across a number of different subjects and contexts.



## Reporting Absences

Please can we remind you of the process for reporting your child's absence. It is our duty of care to know where children are and our Office team have to regularly chase parents and carers on a daily basis when no information has been received regarding an absence.

Parents and carers must inform the school on the first day of absence by 9am giving a specific reason for their child's absence. Saying that your child is 'ill' or 'unwell' is not an adequate reason for absence and if a reason is not provided, the absence will be marked as 'unauthorised'.

Can we also ask that parents and carers maintain daily contact with us until their child returns to school, unless otherwise advised that it is not necessary due to specific/long term illness.
