# A message from Mrs Nichols

Hi, my name is Mrs Nichols and I am the subject leader for Science. Science is a core subject in the national curriculum. As subject leader I oversee the implementation of the science curriculum through liaising with staff, reviewing planning, conducting observations and 'book looks'. Through science we are encouraging children to be curious about the world they live in. Moreover, children can develop a range of skills that can be used across all areas of learning including asking questions, problem-solving, analysing, persevering and being creative.

# Science Week

This week we have been celebrating the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of British Science Week. The theme is 'Time' given the links to so many discoveries in science and indeed as we look to the future.

Our school has been buzzing with engaging. practical learning experiences to fully promote the love of science. During Monday's assembly Mrs Su demonstrated using film cannister rockets to create paint splats. Britto watched water 'walking' between glasses using nothing but a paper towel. Boyce created a pendulum and then investigated the impact of using different weights and lengths of rope. On Wednesday I heard excited cheers coming from Goldsworthy where they were creating rocket balloons and investigating ways of making the rocket balloon travel faster. I loved the 'I wonder' questions that were being posed.

#### Bridgewater Cross Country Event – Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> March

It is a fantastic opportunity to gain experience of friendly competition with peers and children from other schools as well as seeing how a long distance running event works. Year 3 ran 600m, year 4 ran 800m and years 5&6 ran 1,200m. All the runners were guided by a 'hare' from Ashlyns school who ran ahead of them to show them the route around the field. Many children from other local schools took part and the event was a great success.

#### School Meals – Price Increase

As you are aware, our school meals are provided by an external company, Herts Catering Ltd and we have been informed that they are having to increase the price of school meals from after Easter.

From 1<sup>st</sup> April 2024, the cost of a school lunch will be £3.40 per meal.

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will be unaffected as they will continue to receive Universal Free School Meals.

Those children in receipt of benefits related free school meals (Pupil Premium) will also be unaffected.

You may be eligible for Free School Meals/Pupil Premium if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (as long as you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and you don't get more than £16,190 a year)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit (with annual earned income of no more than £7,400 after tax and not including any benefits you get).



#### **Chicken Pox**

Chicken pox can appear at any age. It usually gets better after 1-2 weeks, without the need to see a GP. An itchy, spotty rash is the main symptom, which can appear

Chicken pox appears in 3 stages:

Other symptoms may include high temperature, generally feeling unwell

Children will need to stay off school until all spots have scabbed, usually 5 days after the spots appear.

Headlice can make your head feel itchy or like something is moving in vour hair. Treat headlice as soon as you spot them. You can treat headlice

To remove headlice, comb the hair with a special fine-toothed comb. You can buy these online or at pharmacies. There's no need to keep

Lice can be removed by wet

- Wash hair with ordinary shampoo, apply lots of conditioner.
- 2. Comb the whole head of hair, from the roots to the ends.

Do wet combing on days 1, 5, 9 and 13 to catch any newly hatched head lice. Check again that hair is free of lice after 17 days. See www.nhs.uk/ conditions/head-lice-and-nits/ for


