Punctuality Reminders

Children can enter the classroom between 8:35-8:50am – this is the time you should arrive at school for.

Gates shut at 8:50am – we expect all children to be in school by this time.

It is really important that pupils arrive to school on time. The school doors open at 8.35am to ensure children have time to say good morning to their friends and teachers and put their belongings away. This is a positive and cheerful way to start the day and be ready to learn. When children arrive in class they will have the opportunity to read their books or complete a focused learning task. This is a great way to get children's brains warmed up and ready for registration and their lessons which will start at 8:50am.

Children that are late to their lessons will miss out on all of these valuable experiences which can leave children feeling rushed, flustered and having to catch up on what everyone else is doing. Research tells us that this puts our brains into a high alert state which can impact on our ability to learn effectively. Being on time is so important for our children.

5 minutes late every day for a year is the same as 3 days absent!

Reporting Absences

Please can we also remind you that if your child is unable to attend school due to illness, please can you provide a specific reason for absence. For example, earache, stomach bug, cold, chicken pox etc. rather than "unwell" or "poorly" as this helps us keep track of any bugs which may be going around school.

If you are struggling with any aspect of attendance or punctuality, please do reach out to us. There are many ways that we can work together to improve the situation. Thank you for your ongoing support.

Holiday Requests in Term Time

Can we please remind all parents and carers that children should not be taken out of school during term time for holidays. It is the responsibility of parents to ensure that children of compulsory school age attend school to receive a full time education.

Current government legislation makes it clear that Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. A family holiday does not constitute exceptional circumstances. It is therefore very unlikely that a request for leave of absence during term time will be granted.

A legal penalty notice may also be issued by the Local Authority for unauthorised leave of absence during term time.

Requests for leave must be made to the school in advance. To do this please come into the school office to complete the necessary 'Leave of Absence' application.

We appreciate the challenges that some parents face when booking holidays, particularly during the school holidays. However, by taking family holidays during the designated holiday period you will be supporting your child's full school attendance, learning and development.
