Consulation with you

From September 2024, the length of the school day must equate to 32.5 hours a week (6.5 hours a day).

"The 32.5 hour minimum expectation includes the time in each day from the official start of the school day (i.e. morning registration) to the official end of the compulsory school day (i.e. official home time). The 32.5 hour minimum includes lunch times and other breaks as well as teaching time and any enrichment activities that all pupils are expected to attend. It does not include optional before or after school provision."

In response to this, we plan to make alter our official start and finish times.

PROPOSAL:

From September 2024, school for all children will officially start at 8:45am. School will be open from 8:35 with a soft start for children to arrive and get themselves settled ready of morning registration at 8:45am. Anyone arriving after 8:45am will be marked as late.

From September 2024, the school day will end at 3:15pm for all classes except Reception which will end at 3:10pm.

The change in these hours ensures we are meeting the expectation of 6.5 hours a day.
